


# Bull Breeding Soundness Clinics



**A BSE involves more than just semen collection.**

**Are your bulls ready to turn with the cows and heifers this fall? The best way to find out is to have a veterinarian do a Breeding Soundness Exam (BSE) on them 6 weeks or so ahead of turnout time. This is an insurance policy on your bull for the fall 2019 calf crop.**

Since 2005, 3441 bulls have been checked at these BSE clinics and the fail or defer rate is between 10 to 15%. At the clinics bulls can receive booster vaccinations, are treated for internal and external parasites, Trichomoniasis and genomic testing may be done for an added fee.
